### **KEYNOTE ADDRESS – KNOWING YOUR PERSONAL NARRATIVE**

**PRESENTER: JOHN FRAIRE, VICE PRESIDENT FOR ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT, WASHINGTON STATE UNIVERSITY**

Over the past three decades the college admissions process has become more competitive and stressful. In many respects, the admissions process has turned students into numbers. Mr. Fraire will highlight that knowing your own personal story – your history, your current situation, and your vision for the future – is one of the keys to a successful college admissions process and educational career. *Recommended for all grade levels as the perfect beginning to the evening's program.*

### **FINDING THE RIGHT FIT**

Strategies to find colleges that match a student's profile and interests will be discussed. Defining student priorities and interests is an essential first step in finding colleges that "fit." *Recommended for 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students and families.*

### **PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES IN THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: TRENDS AND OPPORTUNITIES**

Public universities in Washington offer a wide variety of programs. In this session you will learn about new program offerings, trends in admissions practices, and the unique characteristics of each of the public institutions in Washington. *Recommended for all grade levels.*

### **FINANCIAL AID — HOW IT WORKS AND HOW TO QUALIFY**

This session will include information about the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and on scholarships and grants which can also be part of a financial aid package for qualifying students. *Recommended for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students and families. (All grade levels may find it useful.)*

### **COMMUNITY COLLEGE: A GREAT WAY TO START**

Starting your college career at a community college can be a good plan. Our local community colleges offer strong programs and transferring to a four year university can be done smoothly.

### **NAVIGATING THE NCAA CLEARINGHOUSE—COLLEGE FOR THE ATHLETE**

The NCAA Clearinghouse process for student athletic eligibility will be covered. Advanced planning is essential. *Recommended for athletes of all grade levels.*

### **COLLEGE ENTRANCE TESTS: WHY? WHEN? WHICH? HOW DO I PREPARE?**

Both the ACT and the SAT have changes that will affect student planning to use these exams in the college admissions process. You will learn about specific changes, as well as which tests are required or recommended and strategies to prepare for these high-stakes exams. *Recommended for all grades levels.*

## **PAYING FOR COLLEGE WITHOUT GOING BROKE**

Questions such as-- How can we afford private colleges? How can we get scholarships? How does the financial aid system work? Do we qualify for financial aid? How do colleges determine aid? How do 529 plans and the GET program work? We haven't saved enough, what do we do?—will be answered during this session. *Recommended for parents/guardians.*

## **COLLEGES FOR ARTISTICALLY TALENTED STUDENTS**

Learn about the different types of programs in the arts offered in the US & Canada. Understand the process for admissions, including portfolios and auditions. Find out about the future outlook for careers in the arts. It's all in this session!

## **SO HOW DO THEY MAKE THE DECISIONS: THE ADMISSIONS PROCESS AT HIGHLY SELECTIVE COLLEGES**

Representatives from various selective colleges will provide an overview of how their admissions teams evaluate applications. They will also take questions from students and parents/guardians regarding the application review process. *Recommended for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students and families.*

## **APPLYING TO COLLEGE: BEFORE, DURING AND AFTER**

The procedures for processing application documents at your high school, your role in the process, and the timelines that are critical to ease the stress of the college application season (October-January) will be discussed. *Recommended for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students and families.*

## **COLLEGE SUCCESS FOR STUDENTS WITH LEARNING DIFFERENCES--SPECIAL NEEDS ADMISSIONS**

If you or your student has a 504 Plan or an IEP then this session is a must. You will learn what support is available in college and which colleges offer the best support. *Recommended for students in all grades who have special needs.*

## **YOU'RE OFF TO COLLEGE!**

Come to this session to make sure you have the tools to make a good first impression!! Great information for parents/guardians and seniors. Don't miss this presentation! *Recommended for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students.*

## **PUTTING YOURSELF ON PAPER: WRITING THE COLLEGE ESSAY**

The college essay can be a critical part of the college application. Strategies to respond to essay prompts will be reviewed as well as ways to avoid mistakes and how to choose a topic that is appropriate for the essay. *Recommended for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students.*

## **PROGRAMS FOR HONORS STUDENTS RIGHT HERE IN WASHINGTON**
